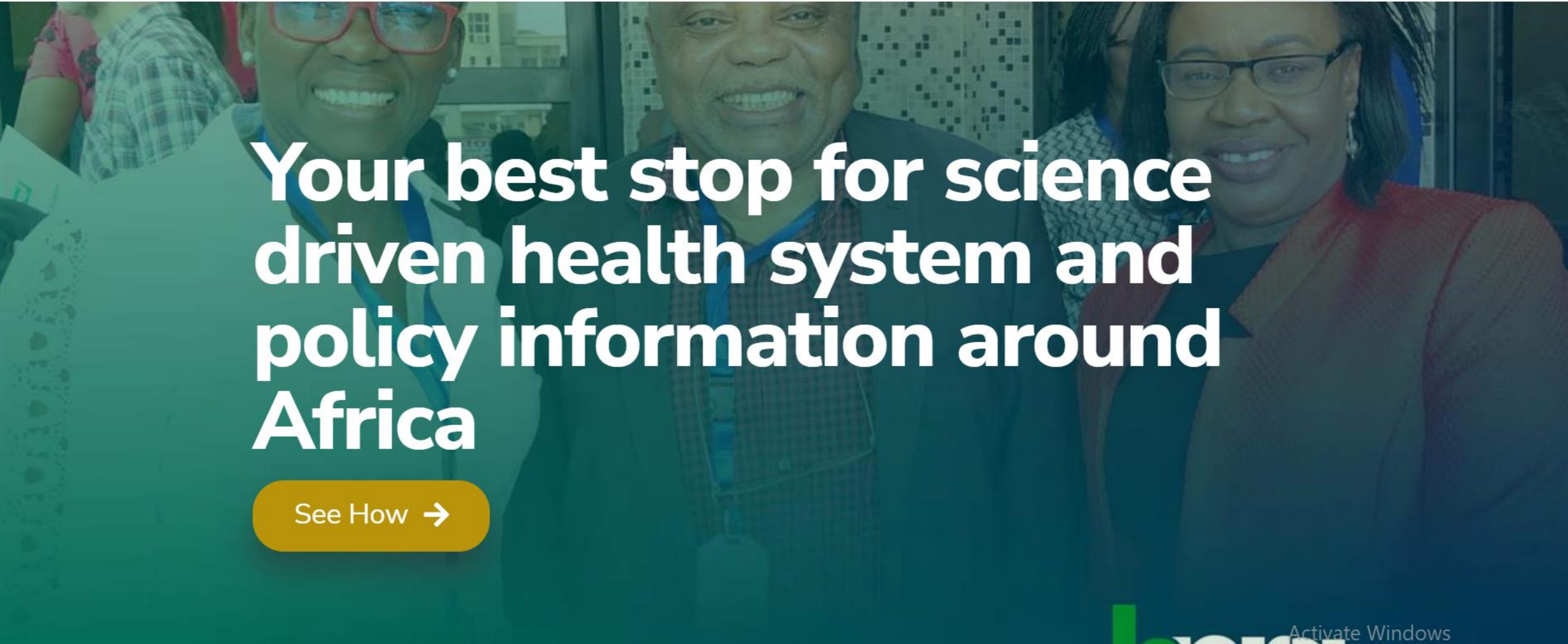
Where do we start?

- Thinking through keywords – if I want anyone to get my article through an internet search, what are the words they can possibly look out for?
 - Google ranking and Search Engine Optimization (SEO)
 - RankBrain (responding to intent than words) – was launched in 2015
- Academic databases respond to Boolean operators and tailors search to intended queries
 - AND – all terms used should be returned by the search e.g., community AND health AND community health AND community health systems AND Africa. So, if there is a document where one is used, and the others are not, that document will be excluded.
 - OR – broadens the search e.g., community OR health OR community health OR community health systems OR Nigeria OR Liberia OR Africa. Here, it returns documents with one or all search terms
 - NOT or AND NOT – community OR health AND NOT community health (it excludes community health)
 - () – The use of parenthesis helps to tailor search more specifically. So, we may have (community OR health) AND community health systems. Here, we will have articles on community and health that must mention community health systems
 - You can play around with the conjunctions to get what you want
